A Message from the Pastor

Did you know that God uses every part of your story for good? Sometimes God works in big, flashy ways, like parting the Red Sea or raising Lazarus from the dead. But sometimes God works behind the scenes, through faithful followers who use their gifts for his purposes. I was thinking of this recently when I realized that we are coming up to the Jewish holiday of Purim that celebrates the story of Esther.

Esther was an ordinary Hebrew woman who used both her gifts and her liabilities to save the nation of Israel. She became the wife of King Xerxes and thwarted a plot to wipe out the Hebrew people. It took a lot of bravery on her part, but she embraced her destiny and did the work God called her to do.

On the surface, Esther looked like an unlikely hero. She was poor, an orphan, and a believer in God—in a culture where no one favored those things. But God also gave Esther gifts. She was smart, which helped her navigate the political intrigue of the palace. She was beautiful, making her stand out to the king. And she had a friendly personality that helped her find favor with many different people. God used her mightily to save her people.

God loves to work through ordinary people. What looks like a recipe for disaster is often the start of God's plan. Everything in your life—even the bad parts or the parts you don't understand—has a purpose.

I grew up in church and heard all about trusting God since I was a little girl. But when life throws a few curve balls at you as an adult, it's challenging to use that faith.

Perhaps you've heard me talk about a rough year or two in my life when Richard went from corporate jobs back to education. He was in and out of work in that time period. I had just quit my job teaching school, we had moved to North Jersey, and I had just begun my classes at seminary. Scared? You bet! Did I pray? Oh yes! But, in that time, I learned to trust God and watch God work things out much better than either Richard or I could have imagined.

Challenging things will happen. Every part of your life will uniquely equip you for what God has planned for you to do. You may not save a nation, as Esther did, but you could bring light to someone who is in darkness. You may not protect an entire group of people, but you could protect and encourage the faith of a family member or young person God has put in your life. All you need to do is remain faithful.





Member Spotlight – John Agner

Long-time member, John Agner, is an attorney and counselor, admitted to the bar in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Colorado. In 1986, he was hired by the Mount Laurel School District as a special education teacher. He was the assistant principal for Winslow High School from 1996 – 2014, a school with 1600 students and over 100 staff. He served in leadership roles in teachers' associations and principals' associations at the local, county and state levels.

John grew up in North Jersey and graduated high school from Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey. He earned his Bachelor of Arts from the Metropolitan State University of Denver in Political Science and Government and then went on to earn a Master of Arts in Education from the University of Northern Colorado and a Master of Arts from Colorado State University in Secondary School Administration/Principalship. Finally, John earned his Doctor of Law with High Honors from Rutgers Law School.

John is proud to be a dad and pop-pop. He is the caretaker for his mom and his elderly aunt. His interests include hiking, skiing, motorcycles, soccer, politics, education, law, and community service. John continues to travel to Colorado and elsewhere for skiing in the winter.
